HOUSE TO HOUSE COLLECTIONS REGULATIONS, 1947

Application for a Certificate of Exemption of a Local Collection of a Transitory Nature

To the Chief Constable of the WILTSHIRE CONSTABULARY, LONDON ROAD, DEVIZES, WILTSHIRE.

NOTE THE FOLLOWING DEFINITIONS OF EXPRESSIONS USED ABOVE.

"CHARITABLE PURPOSE" means any charitable, benevolent or philanthropic purpose;
"COLLECTION" means an appeal to the Public, made by means of visits from house to house, to give, *whether for consideration or not*, money or other property; and
"COLLECTOR" means a person who makes the appeal in the course of such visits; "PROMOTER" means a person who causes others to act, *whether for remuneration or otherwise*, as Collectors for the purposes of the Collection; and "promote" and "promotion" have corresponding meanings
